The course will interpret the unique status of the River Dart and its catchment, defined by the diversity of its geology, geography and communities that have evolved over the millennia.

Thanks to the inspiration of Geography teachers at Blundells School, then later at St. Luke's College, he developed a fascination for, and love of, landscape.
